Have you ever noticed these scruffy cottages on the corner of Horsefair and wondered what they are doing there?

Kidderminster once had many houses like these. Before the carpet industry, weavers made black cloth called Bombazine on small looms upstairs in their own homes. Kidderminster was famous for its Bombazine.

We have secured a mix of grant and loan funding by the <u>Heritage Lottery Fund</u>, the <u>Pilgrim Trust</u>, the <u>Garfield Weston Foundation</u>, the <u>D'Oyly Carte Charitable Trust</u> and the <u>Architectural Heritage Fund</u> to repair and conserve the cottages back to their former glory on the outside, and to return to use as houses on the inside.
