

About the Project

Have you ever noticed the

scruffy cottages on the corner of Horsefair and wondered what they are doing there? They have now been transformed and conserved into dwellings. Kidderminster once had many houses like these. Before the carpet industry, weavers made black cloth called Bombazine on small looms upstairs in their own homes. Kidderminster was famous for its Bombazine. We secured a mix of grant and loan funding from the Heritage Lottery Fund, the Pilgrim Trust, the Garfield Weston Foundation, the D'Oyly Carte Charitable Trust and the Architectural Heritage Fund to repair and conserve the cottages.
